Why are Fee Updates Important?

Subsidies in services impact the General Fund

- Private & specific benefit services are subsidized by unobligated funding sources
- Reduces ability to fund general & community benefits

Why Ongoing Increases are

- Many agencies fall behind the cost of doing business
- Creates an implicit subsidy from the General Fund
- Creating an ongoing CPI increase creates a reasonable escalation that benefits the City, Community, and connected service delivery

Determine full cost of providing services or programs

Review fee schedules based on service delivery

Using fully-burdened rates, calculate full cost recovery

 Identifying recreation/facility fee; demand driven (separate process from other user fees)

- Update fees for service based on cost analysis
 - Incorporate or establish cost recovery goals
 - Identify appropriate fee levels that:
 - Enhance reasonability and applicability
 - Maintain consistency with local policies and objectives
 - Maintain legal compliance with state law

Community Development Fees

- Maintaining Deposit structure for many fees with a transition to actual cost at revised reimbursement rates
- Other fee increases are largely contributed with a more accurate review of total staff cost/overhead

- Police
 - Fee increases are based on inflation cost increases
- Facility and Park Rental
 - Increases based on more accurate assessment of staff cost and time

- Clayton Community Park
 - Utilizing fully burdened rates plus more accurate staff time estimates
- Special Event Fees
 - Street Closure Fee
 - Changed to a market rate approach by event size
 - Event Size will be through estimate from organizers
 - Staff will work on operationalizing auditing of participant counts

- Administrative Fees
 - Utilizing fully burdened rates plus more accurate staff time estimates; relatively minor increases

Policy Discussion

- General standard: unless prescribed differently by council, individuals or groups who receive private benefit from service should pay 100% of cost
- In certain situations, subsidization is an effective public policy tool:
 - Encourage participation
 - Ensure compliance when cost is prohibitive to residents
 - Promote access to services
 - Promote community involvement/global community benefit usually related to the work of 501c3 organizations

Staff Recommendation

- Policy recommendation from user fee study
 - Inflation factor to annually adjust fees based on CPI, MOU, or another factor
 - Staff recommend Consumer Price Index (CPI)
- Comprehensive analysis and update every 3-5 years
- Policy Direction needed on Council's desire to add a subsidy level for 501c3 organizations related to Special Event Fees/Street Closures
