Message from the City Manager

Senior Services

As a City, we do not have a specific unit that addresses senior services, but we understand this is a need within our community.

To assist with this need, the City has been talking to Clayton Valley Village about ways we can work together to continue to grow our senior service offering through them and other related agencies.

This includes enhancing our partnership as well as non-profits like Clayton Valley Village with our County Health and Human Services Agency. For those that may not know, County HHSA has a specific unit around aging and senior services,

City staff has started this dialogue with the County and is looking forward to developing a fruitful connection for these services within the Clayton Community.



ADA Work

The City of Clayton has an Americans for Disability Act (ADA) Transition Program to gradually replace and upgrade pedestrian facilities to current standards per the 1990 Americans for Disability Act administered by the U.S. Department of Justice.

Generally, as street pavement is rehabilitated, sidewalk and curb ramps along the same street are required to be upgraded to the current standards (curb ramps with max slopes, landing space, yellow detectable warning surfaces)

In addition to budgeting ADA upgrades as part of our street rehabilitation projects, the City of Clayton has standalone capital improvement program that targets removing barriers to accessibility in the public right of way that has \$100,000 budgeted every two years for constructing ADA improvements.

In the Summer 2024, the City will be focused on curb ramp upgrades

In the meantime, if you know someone who is in need of senior related services Clayton Valley Village is a non-profit that is ready to help.
